The Duke of Portland has received your letter of the 4<sup>th</sup> Inst. respecting a Foreigner lately arrived at your port who wishes to proceed to some of the manufacturing towns in Yorksh<sup>r</sup>. & Lancashire but as it appears that the enclosure to which you refer for his name, was not put up with the letter I cannot send you the necessary directions until I receive the name and particulars.

Genl. Lud<sup>g</sup> Dahlman the Swedish Genl. mentioned in yours of the 28<sup>th</sup> Ult<sup>o</sup>. has not yet been applied for at this office ~ therefore no permission to proceed can yet be granted him.

I herewith transmit you a licence for Mr. Beon<sup>r</sup>. Phemank, lately arrived at your port and who is desirous of continuing to reside there ~ as also one for a person shortly expected from the Continent which I am to desire you will deliver to him when he has made his Declaration.
